Students with completed applications can expect a decision within three weeks. gvsu.edu/apply

On-Campus Housing Application Available

Freshmen are required to live on campus. Once you have been admitted to GVSU, you should apply for housing online at gvsu.edu/housing. The housing application deadline is **May 1**, but students who apply early are more likely to receive their first or second housing choice.

OCTOBER

File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Complete the FAFSA at **studentaid.gov/fafsa** starting **October 1**. Although the priority filing deadline is **March 1**, we recommend filing the FAFSA early in order to maximize scholarship and grant eligibility. **GVSU school code: 002268**

NOVEMBER

Apply for Scholarships through myScholarships

After you are admitted to GVSU, begin applying for scholarships through **myScholarships at gvsu.edu/myscholarships**. The myScholarships database has more than 500 scholarship opportunities. For maximum scholarship consideration, submit your FAFSA before visiting the myScholarships database.

JANUARY

Financial Aid Award Notifications Sent

Incoming students who have filed their FAFSA will receive their award notifications beginning in January.

MARCH

Application Deadline for Merit-based Admission Scholarships

To be considered for merit-based admission scholarships, you must be admitted by March 1, 2023 for Fall 2023 admission. View these scholarships at gvsu.edu/scholarships

Priority deadline for fling the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

File the FAFSA by March 1 to be considered for the maximum amount of financial aid.

MAY Commit to GVSU

Make a commitment to attend GVSU by **May 1**, which is National Decision Day. Schedule your Advising and Registration session at **gvsu.edu/orientation**.

JUNE Housing Application Deadline

Housing and roommate assignments will be sent in June.
